The James E. Carter at Georgia Southwestern State University celebrated its 50th anniversary as a member of the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP) on September 13, 2016 with an open house. Faculty, students, staff, and the community were invited to attend the function, which featured a cake with the FDLP logo. The James Earl Carter Library was designated a selective Federal Depository Library on September 13, 1966. As such, the library





receives publications in hardcopy, microform, and electronic formats from most federal government agencies. The library currently owns more than 400,000 government publications that have been selected to serve the information needs of the students and faculty of Georgia Southwestern State University as well as the citizens of the second US Congressional District of Georgia. The majority of government document materials are circulating and special arrangements may be made for those designated as non-circulating.
