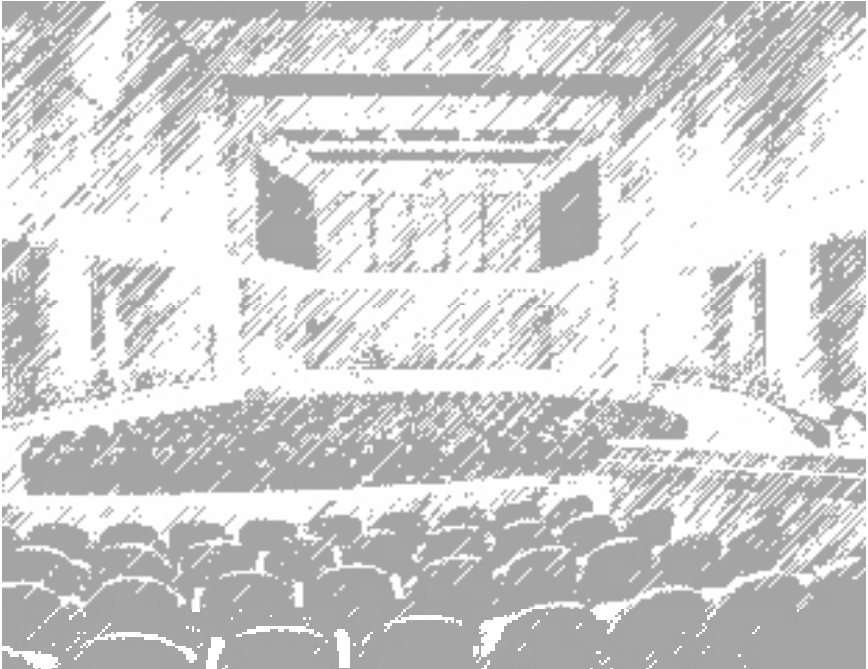

# Biography

**J**ustin Brookins began his musical studies at the age of eight as part of the Georgia Young Singers of Kennesaw State University music program. He showed a thirst for knowledge from the onset, picking up the viola while in middle school and continuing his studies through the public school orchestra program. At 14, Justin began studying privately; first with Jacob Yampolsky, then with Allyson Fleck. Justin followed Dr. Fleck to Kennesaw State University, where he is finishing his degree in Viola Performance.

Extracurricularly, Justin has continually sought complementary education to the basics that he received from school. He has attended music clinics at the University of Georgia and Kennesaw State University, as well as being one of a select few high school juniors and sophomores to participate in the Georgia Governor's Honor Program. Recently, Justin attended the Sewanee Summer Music Festival in central Tennessee, and he is performing the Hoffmeister *Viola Concerto in D* in October of 2013.

Justin has performed masterclasses with Philip Ying (Ying Quartet), Jessica Oudin (Atlanta Symphony Orchestra), Lachlan Macbane (ASO), Katherine Lewis (Illinois State University), Daphne Gerling (North Texas State University), Matthew Michelic (Lawrence University Conservatory of Music), Vicki Chiang (Aspen String Trio), and Robert Spano (Atlanta Symphony Orchestra).

Justin aspires to continue his studies of music at the graduate and post graduate level in hopes of teaching at the university level.
