A graduate of Kennesaw State University in trumpet performance, Mr. Watson is an active teacher and performer in the state of Georgia. A member of MENC and GMEA, Mr. Watson has served frequently as adjudicator of GMEA events. Additionally, he has performed with Jon Faddis, Nestor Torres, Amy Grant, Edwin Bonilla, as a member of the Hollywood Hills Orchestra, the Theater in the Square's 1940s Radio Hour, and as leader his own ensemble, Swing Shift. Mr. Watson joined the faculty at KSU in 2001.

The KSU Jazz Ensemble

Led by Steven Watson, The Jazz Ensemble is comprised of instrumentalists from KSU and the community by audition. The Jazz Ensemble performs a great variety of styles and composers, performing six times yearly. Recent performances have included programs of Brazilian and Latin jazz, swing concerts, music from the musical theatre, jazz rock, and retrospectives of such composers as Duke Ellington, Stan Kenton, Count Basie, and others.

Membership in the ensemble develops general jazz performance and improvisational skills, giving students the flexibility to meet the varying demands of today's musical world. These goals are pursued through rehearsals, workshops, and performances of the full jazz ensemble as well as numerous small combos.
