FACULTY DEVELOPMENT GRANTS AND SUMMER STIPENDS ANNOUNCED

The Faculty Development Committee has issued a call for applications for Faculty Development Grants and Summer Stipends for 1992-93. The grant fund provides a total of \$8,000 to support projects related to scholarly activity, curriculum development/course improvement, or individual professional development. A full time KSC faculty member may apply for up to \$2,000. Also, seven summer salary stipends (each for 10% of the applicant's academic year salary) are available for the 1992 Summer Quarter. These awards will allow faculty to pursue interests in

a variety of areas including, but not limited to: instructional enhancement, curricula innovation, development of interdisciplinary connections, creation of capstone experiences, development of a departmental assessment model, new community service thrusts, development of teaching conferences, research in teaching the non-traditional student, or developing a pilot project which will lead to external funding. The application deadline for both the Faculty Development Grants and the Summer Stipends is April 10, 1992.
